

Confirmation for the compliance of REACH order 1907/2006/EC (SVHC list)

REACH is the abbreviation for **R**egistration, **E**valuation, **A**uthorisation and Restriction of **C**hemicals.

REACH is an EU regulation with the number 1907/2006/EC, which came into force on 01 June 2007 with the purpose of harmonising the national chemicals laws. EGGER is aware of its tasks and obligations with regard to the regulation.

The products produced by EGGER

- DHF, sawn timber (finger jointed), roof batten (finger jointed)
- OSB, OSB Flammex, ErgoBoard, DecoWall and EcoBox

are "articles" in the sense of REACH. REACH does not provide for registration or pre-registration of articles. There are, however, information obligations regarding SVHC substances.

SVHC list

The REACH Regulation provides that Substances of Very High Concern (SVHC) are subject to a special authorisation procedure. These SVHC are subject to an obligation to inform within the supply chain if an article contains a substance from the candidate list in a concentration of more than 0.1% (w/w).

We hereby confirm that no substance from the candidate list is present in the above mentioned products in a quantity requiring information.

Annex XIV and Annex XVII

These annexes contain substances for which authorisations are required or their use has been restricted or prohibited.

We hereby confirm that we comply with the requirements of Annex XIV and XVII.

SCIP database

The SCIP database was set up by ECHA under the Waste Framework Directive and contains information on SVHCs in articles. An entry is only foreseen if the concentration of an SVHC in an article is above 0.1%(m/m). As described above, this is not the case for EGGER products, so registration is not necessary.
